

12 of the Statute by making it possible for any applicant to continue a case indefinitely by a series of successive applications for revision. Even if the time-limits did not apply, the material presented by the Applicant after so many years and without any indication of how and from where it was obtained cannot bring into question the evidence on which the Tribunal based its Judgement No. 265.

III. The Tribunal holds that the application is not receivable inasmuch as it was made after the expiry of the two time-limits prescribed in article 12.

IV. The application is therefore rejected.
